

CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE INFORMATION SHEET

The state of Kentucky has recently passed House Bill 1 in regards to the dispensing of controlled substances. Prescriptions filled for controlled substances are now closely followed and kept on record by the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA). This is called a KASPER report. The report allows physicians, the DEA and local law enforcement officials to track and prosecute people who are misusing controlled substances. Periodically a KASPER report will be requested on all individuals receiving controlled substance prescriptions from our office.

Our office policy on controlled substances will be strictly enforced in order to protect our patients. It is also important to note the following office policies:

- Medications will not be authorized after business hours, on weekends, or holidays.
- It is the patient's responsibility to protect and be in control of his/her medications at all times. Lost, stolen or damaged medications will NOT be refilled until the scheduled due date. If your medication is stolen, a signed police report must be turned in to our office.
- Medication must be taken at a rate no greater than the prescribed rate, and use of the medication at a greater rate will result in you being without medication for a period of time.
